
# Strengthening Veterinary Services OIE Capacity building activities

**Performance of Veterinary Services** 






# **OIE PVS Approach**

- External independent evaluation (objectivity)
  - Experts trained and certified by the OIE
  - Based on facts & evidence
- Upon request of the country (voluntary basis)
- To assess:
  - Compliance with OIE Standards
  - Strengths / Weaknesses
  - Gaps / areas for improvement
- Recognised by international donors
- Country property (confidentiality of results)






### The Diagnosis – The OIE PVS Evaluation Tool



#### **OIE PVS Tool: Levels of Advancement**

- 5 levels of advancement for each critical competency (CC)
- A higher level assumes compliance with all preceding levels

# **The OIE PVS Evaluation Tool**


- The sixth edition (2013) includes:
  - Modification of some CC, in particular competencies dealing with veterinary education and animal welfare,
  - Adding of 3 CCs (laboratory infrastructure; Regulation, authorisation and inspection of establishments, inspection food safety; and animal feed safety)
  - Now 47 critical competencies in total



# **OIE PVS Gap Analysis**

- Identify specific activities, tasks and resources required to address "gaps" identified through the country PVS evaluation
- Determine and confirm country priorities (country involvement)
- Estimation of costs (collaboration with Partners and Donors)
- Preparation of an estimated budget
- To Support to preparation of investment programmes











- > Publication on the OIE website
  - > Always upon agreement of the Delegate
- Guide on the use of the OIE PVS Evaluation and PVS Gap Analysis reports – under development



#### **Taking Ownership – Countries activities**

- Communication of the results within and outside the Veterinary Services
  - > To raise awareness with all stakeholders
- > Contact with donor agencies
- Contact with regional and international technical organisations
- > Creation of a "PVS Committee"
- > Ownership and sustainability
