

Regional Capacity Building Activities

- Regional capacity building programmes for OIE Members' Veterinary Services are established annually.
- Such programmes aim to strengthen animal disease surveillance and control, early outbreak detection and rapid response at both regional and national level.
- This facilitates networking between OIE
 Delegates and OIE National Focal Points.



Regional Capacity Building Activities (cont.)

- OIE Regional Representations organise
 - Training Seminars for the OIE National Focal Points (every two years in each region)
 - Training for OIE Delegates
 - Regional meetings of Delegates (every year)
 - Regional Conferences (every two years)

- OIE Focal Point
 - under the authority of the OIE Delegate.
- OIE Focal Point
 - under the Veterinary Service, or other Departments or Ministries



TOR's of Animal Welfare Focal Points

- Establish:
 - Network of animal welfare
 - Dialogue, cooperation and communication with other relevant authorities and stakeholders



TOR's of Animal Welfare Focal Points

- National consultation process
 - OIE Terrestrial and Aquatic Codes
 - Animal Welfare Working Group
 - Other relevant documents
- Prepare comments and proposals for the Delegate

General Objectives of the RAWS

- OIE Standards Implementation
 - Ensuring a coordinated regional approach
- Promotion Achievement Awareness Understanding
- Coordination, Communication, Education and Training.



General Objectives of the RAWS

- Research: Regional International
 - Regional approach for implementation
- Development of sustainable mechanisms to coordinate and promote animal welfare programs and priorities





Africa

- Southern African Animal Welfare Action Plan in development
 - Based on outcomes of Focal Points Training
 - Interaction with the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Livestock Technical Committee (Endorsed)
 - Supported by Collaborating Centres
 - Baseline country assessments (2010)
 - Future endorsement with stakeholders







Americas

- 1st Inter American Meeting on Animal welfare, Panama, 2008
 - Strategic position for the Americas
 - Involvement of the Inter-American Committee for **Animal Welfare**
- Strategy drafted / distributed / commented
- To be proposed for adoption during Regional Conference in 2012





Asia, Far East and Oceania



- Animal Welfare Workshop (Nov 2007)
- Drafted by the Implementation Working Group (Nov 2008)
- Endorsed at the 26th Conference of the OIE Regional Commission, (Nov 2009)
- Planning workshop (Apr 2010)
- Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (Australia) - interim secretariat





Asia, Far East and Oceania (cont.)



- 3rd meeting of the RAWS-Coordination Group: April 2012 Bangkok.
- 4th meeting back to back with the OIE Global Conference, 2012
- The strategy and implementation plan will be reviewed and updated over the next few months





Europe

Different situations and objectives:
 EU vs non-EU Member Countries.

Requires a progressive approach to:

- Implement the OIE Standards
- Cover the gap between non-EU /EU Member Countries
- 2012 FP Seminar in Kiev
 - Model for discussion / basis for networking
 - Need of drafting a stepwise approach
 - Need to implement the OIE Standards





Europe (cont.)

• 25th Conference of the Regional Commission for Europe, Fleesensee, Germany

Technical Item: "Regional Steps towards common AW approach in Europe"

- Recommendations:
 - Agreement for a regional mechanism to facilitate the implementation of OIE Standards of AW in the region (Concept note) to be endorsed during the next Regional Commission Meeting (May 2013)
 - Future decision on possible actions





Middle East

- OIE Workshop for FP in 2010 Priorities:
 - Transport of Animals
 - Improve animal handling before and during slaughter, killing for disease control
 - Control of stray dog population /use of animals in laboratories and education
 - Applying AW Standards in regulations and legislations
- Ad-Hoc Working Groups
- Results planned for 2013 2014



Main Contents of the RAWS

Common aspects

- Implementation through activities such as education, regulation, research and development;
- Stakeholders, including farmers, industry, NGOs, academia, and the veterinary profession are actively involved in the process
- Flexibility to adapt the standards to social, religious, cultural and economic situation.
